The Commission has been working for a culture of peace since 1988. Here are some of the things we have done in the past few years.

- Published an annual report on the State of the Culture of Peace in New Haven with policy recommendations.
- Celebrated the International Day of Peace (September 21) with libraries, community groups and schools of New Haven, as well as events to mark Hiroshima Day and Nagasaki Day (August 6 and 9)
- Sponsored exhibitions of art for peace
- Sponsored film series at the New Haven Free Public Library
- Sponsored a citywide election referendum to convert the national budget from military spending to human needs
- Held meetings, hearings and actions on issues concerning the culture of peace such as gun violence, restorative justice in the schools, civilian review board and immigrant rights.

The Peace Commission was instrumental in founding the International Association of Peace Messenger Cities during the United Nations International Year of Peace in 1986. It was then was established as part of the New Haven city government with the support of the New Haven Board of Alders. Commissioners are appointed to three-year terms.
